I. Old Business

The minutes of the meeting of 10/20/76 were amended to show that later approval was given by Dean Ballantyne to LPSY 441-4, Experimental Social Psychology, when clarifications concerning funding for the computer were obtained. The minutes were approved in this revised form.

II. New Business

- 1) LBJO 470/570 Tundra Biomes and
LBJO 495/595 Pollination Ecology
were amended to show that they will be offered in
alternate years only. Approved in amended form.
- 2) LBJO 501 Seminar in Biology
no motion made. Graduate courses must be submitted to
the Graduate School.
- 3) LBJO 108-3 Biological Basis of Health Sciences
was approved with the following corrections:
 - a) may satisfy the LAS natural science requirement
 - b) may count toward the biology major
 - c) prerequisite should include consent of the pre-
allied health advisor
 - d) credit will not be given for both LBJO 108 and 110.
- 4) LPSC 300-2 Practical Politics as Practiced in Colorado
was denied. The following reasons were offered as guidelines
for resubmission of the course to the committee:
 - a) The course is not appropriate to a liberal arts
curriculum. A more analytical approach seems called for.
 - b) The workshop nature of the course is more suited to a
non-credit, continuing education format.
 - c) If the textbook were specified, the committee could
ascertain whether indeed the course will be sufficiently
analytical in nature.
 - d) A course of this nature should not be offered at the
upper division level. The committee felt that a 100
level designation would be more appropriate.
- 5) LPSC 320-2 War and Politics Approved
- 6) LID 100-3 Human Biology and Disease
LID 110-2 Human Sexual Function and Behavior
were approved. Both courses are to be offered this summer
on a trial basis. They may not count as natural sciences.
- 7) LPSC 201-3 Intro to Comparative Politics
approved.
- 8) GES 200-3 World Geographic Problems
credit change from 3 to 4 hours approved.

- 9) ^{Teatro} ~~Workshop in Chicano Theatre:~~ Number and Department change approved from ~~LSPN 300-3~~ to LSPN 345-3/346-3. Additional credit would be approved later if it could be shown to be warranted.
- 10) The proposal for LAS Interdepartmental course guidelines: Dr. Null moved to accept the proposal as presented, with modifications to be made as initiation and implementation of the program dictate. Fernandez seconded.

It was pointed out that the proposal contains no preamble or opening paragraph which explains the overall purposes of the program. Discussion of purpose at the faculty meeting where the program was originally proposed centered on: (1) courses that overlap departmental boundaries and (2) experimental courses that may eventually either spin off into new departments or be incorporated into existing departments.

After discussion it was resolved that the proposal be considered at a later open meeting. Advance notice to all LAS faculty would include a request for submission of proposed statements of general purpose. Meanwhile, Schoffstall's proposal will serve as a working model.
